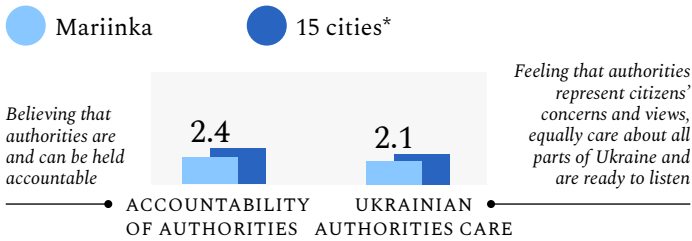
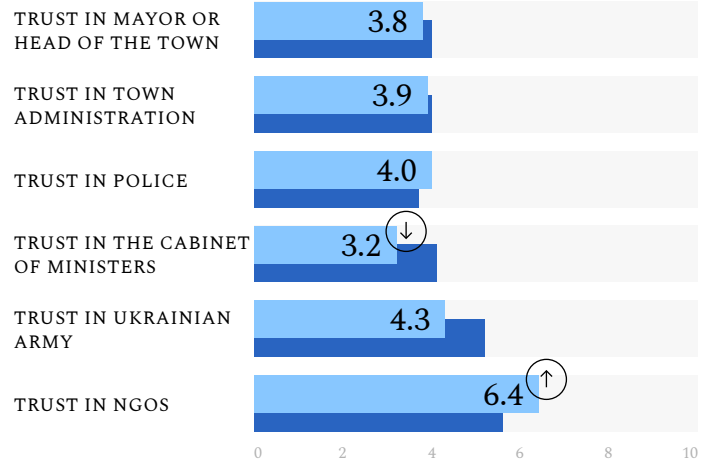
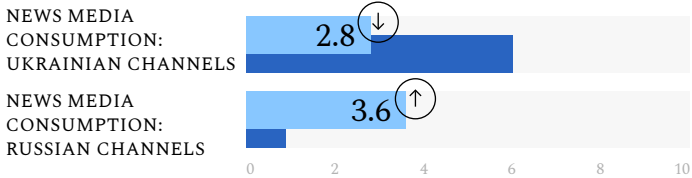

✓ *Prioritize the role of national, regional, and independent media in building trust and combating biased and fake news. Use information to strengthen the peaceful and constructive environment in a society.*

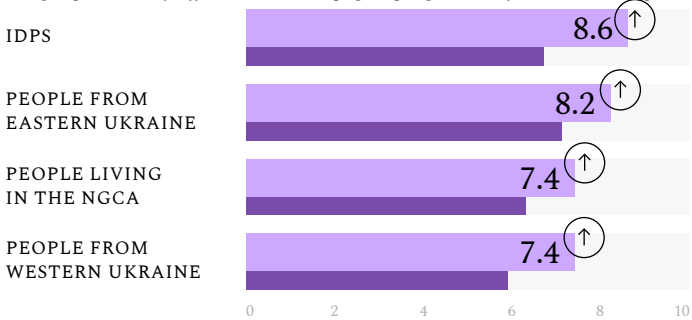

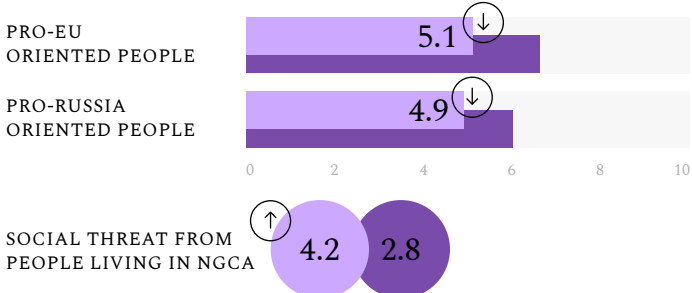

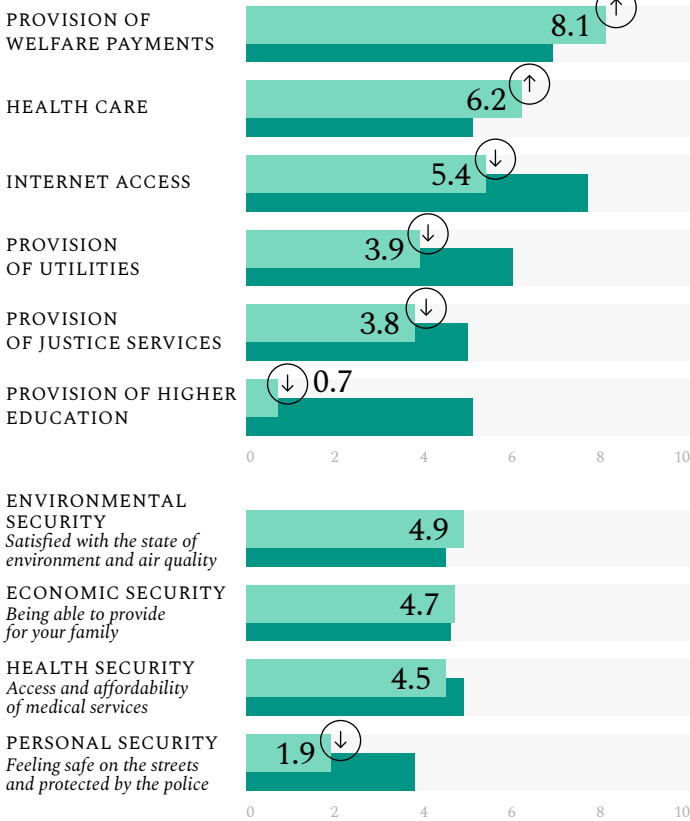

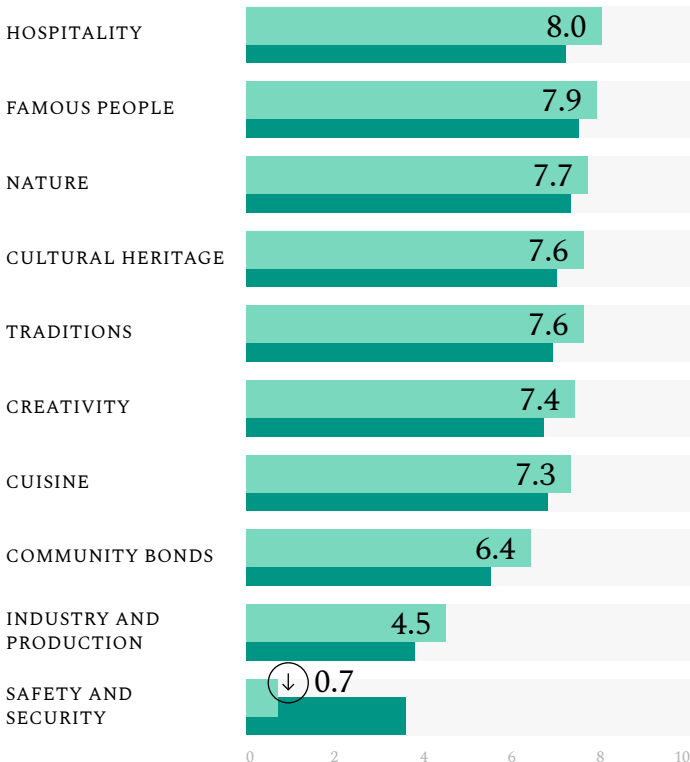

PRIDE IN YOUR LOCALITY

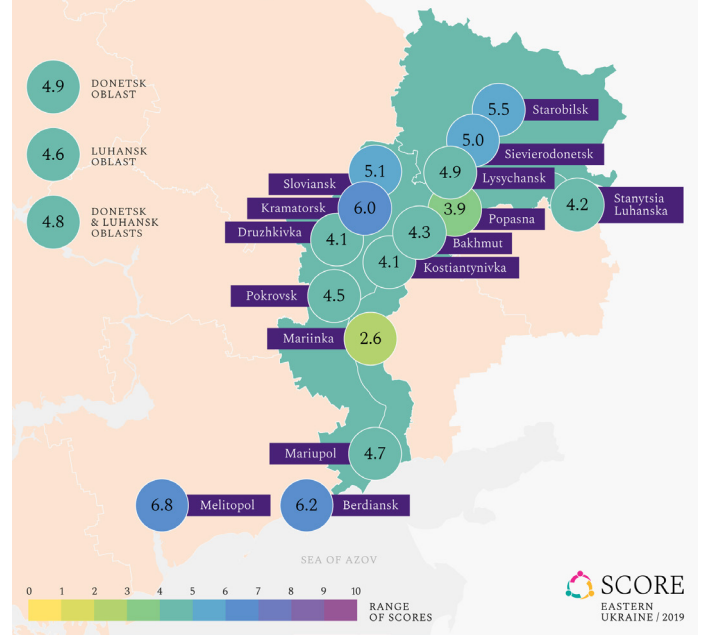
To what extent are you proud of the following in you locality?

POLITICAL SECURITY

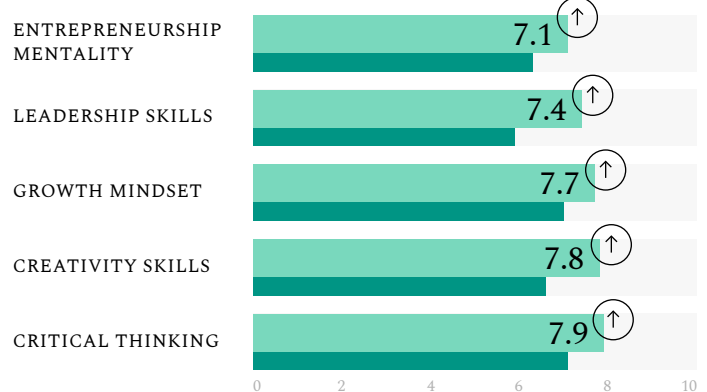
